- **Screen Resolution:** Photography and editing work require true-to-life image reproduction on the screen for high-quality pictures. Aim for at least a Full HD (1920x1080) monitor for photo editing.
- **Panel Types:** In-plane switching (IPS) LCD panels offer consistency and a broad range of color space.
- **HDR (High Dynamic Range) Support:** Proper color display is vital. Your monitor should cover at least 90% of sRGB and 70% of the Adobe RGB spectrum. These color spectrums are industry standards.
